Farmingdale High School is proud to recognize Emily Dorso as valedictorian of the Class of 2011. Emily has taken advantage of the opportunities provided by the high school to better her own future and the community itself. While maintaining a GPA of 104.187 through a rigorous curriculum of Advanced Placement (AP) courses, she has been actively involved in other curricular and co-curricular programs offered through Farmingdale School District. An outstanding academic, Emily worked to pass on the gift of learning as a tutor to elementary-age children and adolescents in social studies, math and science. Her scholarly achievements granted her induction into the National Honor Society and Tri-M Music Honor Society, as well as the Spanish Honor Society, for which she served as president for two years. Emily embodies a true leader and has been humble and respectful while achieving her accolades, according to Farmingdale High School Principal Glen Zakian. Elected captain of the softball and basketball (JV) teams, Emily is a stellar athlete. She was awarded the All-Division Softball honor and traveled with the Long Island Xplosion softball team during her junior year of high school. Emily is musically talented as well. For the last two years, she served as a drum major for the award-winning Farmingdale Marching Band. Emily led rehearsals and conducted performances at football games, homecoming parades and the Newsday Marching Band Festival. She also participated in Wind Ensemble for four consecutive years and is an All-State flutist. Salutatorian Saniya Khan

Class of 2011 salutatorian Saniya Khan started challenging herself to the highest extent in the eighth grade. This past year, she was enrolled in the school's most difficult Advanced Placement (AP) courses and graduates with a 103.855 GPA. Her academic prowess entails averaging 96+ on the ten Regents exams she has completed. An outstanding math scholar and member of Mathletes, Saniya's performance in the Math and Financial Applications Competitions merited first place from the Long Island Business Teachers' Association. To gain career-related experience for tax-return preparation, she interned for 100+ hours at G&G Accounting Agency. Saniya was also a DECA National Honor Society Inductee as well as a two-time regional competition winner; she placed in the Top 10 at the Accounting Competition at Distributive Education Clubs of America (DECA). A competitive athlete, Saniya excelled in varsity tennis and badminton, and instructed elementary-level children in tennis. Saniya has devoted much of her time to helping others. She served as president of the school's Interact Club, and has aided relief funds for Haiti and Africa. She helped raise \$1,500 in funds for those affected by the Pakistani floods and monsoons, and has significantly contributed to UNICEF and Breast Cancer Research annually, as well as volunteering for Habitat for Humanity and Ronald McDonald charities. In addition, she was a board member for Autism Speaks. Saniya's achievements have granted her acceptance into the Business Honors and Honors Program at Molloy College, where she will continue her education this fall.

Angela Ferrari-Aldieri, DDS – Class of 1993

Dr. Ferrari-Aldieri practices cosmetic dentistry in Farmingdale, and is an active contributor to the community. A member of the Farmingdale Breakfast Rotary and the Junior League of the Women's Club of Farmingdale, she also volunteers her time as a guest speaker at schools, churches and scouting groups.

Gina O'Dea-Serafin – Class of 1982

Ms. O'Dea-Serafin, recipient of the 2007 Yale University Distinguished Music Educator Award, is a music teacher with the Chappaqua Central School District. Farmingdale Students Perform Exceptionally Well in Olympics of the Visual Arts

In March, Farmingdale competed in the Olympics of the Visual Arts (OVA) at both the middle and high school levels. Our district sent a total of nine OVA teams to Saratoga Springs, where the students garnered an unprecedented seven total awards. The contest presented students in each of several categories with specific challenges to be addressed in their work, and judges evaluated them on creativity and originality. Students from a total of 40 school districts across New York State had less than an hour to set up their respective exhibits before solving the spontaneous problem. The preparation for the competition begins in September and requires many hours of focused work and the utmost dedication before the students present in the spring. OVA coaches Jessica Martinez, Laura Steffen and Eunice Vega assisted Farmingdale students in developing their artistic problem-solving skills.

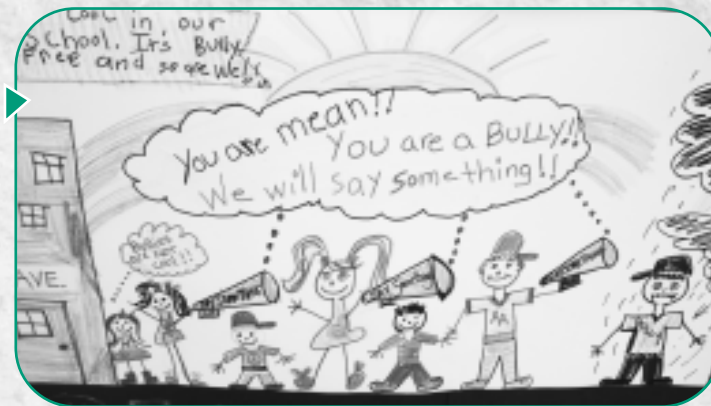

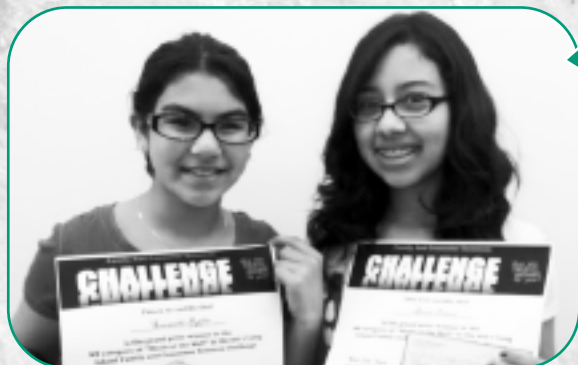


SEM Odyssey of the Mind Students Show Off Their Creativity in Maryland

In May, over 20,000 students and supporters from around the world traveled to the University of Maryland for the 32nd annual Odyssey of the Mind World Finals competition. Six fifth grade students from SEM earned the honor of competing at this prestigious event as a result of their state competition standing. They joined teams from many countries around the world and practically every state in the U.S. Our students competed in the long-term category and placed 5th out of 52 teams for their responses during the spontaneous problem-solving event. All of the students participated in a float parade highlighting individual creativity and pride for their respective states and countries. Awards were given for the most creative floats and banners, and New York State was presented with one of the awards – again highlighting Saltzman East Memorial's students' skills. Odyssey of the Mind was founded on the idea of innovative thinking and recognizes exceptional creativity through this competition.

Junior Zoologists at Woodward Parkway

Jane Wind's and Maria Lucchi's second grade zoologists hosted an Animal Kingdom Museum at Woodward Parkway to celebrate the conclusion of a study linking reading workshop and writing with science. Students learned reading strategies to aid them in gathering animal facts from non-fiction picture books, magazines, websites and other multimedia sources. During the writing workshop, students organized their findings and used the information to publish thorough informational pieces. In May, parents, family members and staff were invited to interview the student zoologists about their animals and review the students' written work. Animal crackers were enjoyed by all and the optional admission donations were sent to an animal rescue organization.



Howitt Middle School's FACS Winners

Students Samantha Raifer and Ariela Deleon earned the top honors among Long Island middle schoolers in the Long Island Family and Consumer Science (FACS) Professionals Challenge Contest Series. Given a "budget" of \$7, each competing student analyzed four mall restaurant menus and designed meals with fewer than 700 calories and 720 mg. of sodium. Both Howitt winners were honored at the Long Island FACS Professionals End-of-the-year Dinner in May and each received a grand prize of \$100.

The Civic Responsibility Club at Northside Elementary School hosted a spring carnival earlier this year. The event was the culmination of the school's spirit week (May 23-27), in which students wore crazy hats, team jerseys and pajamas, and showed off their green and white Daler colors. 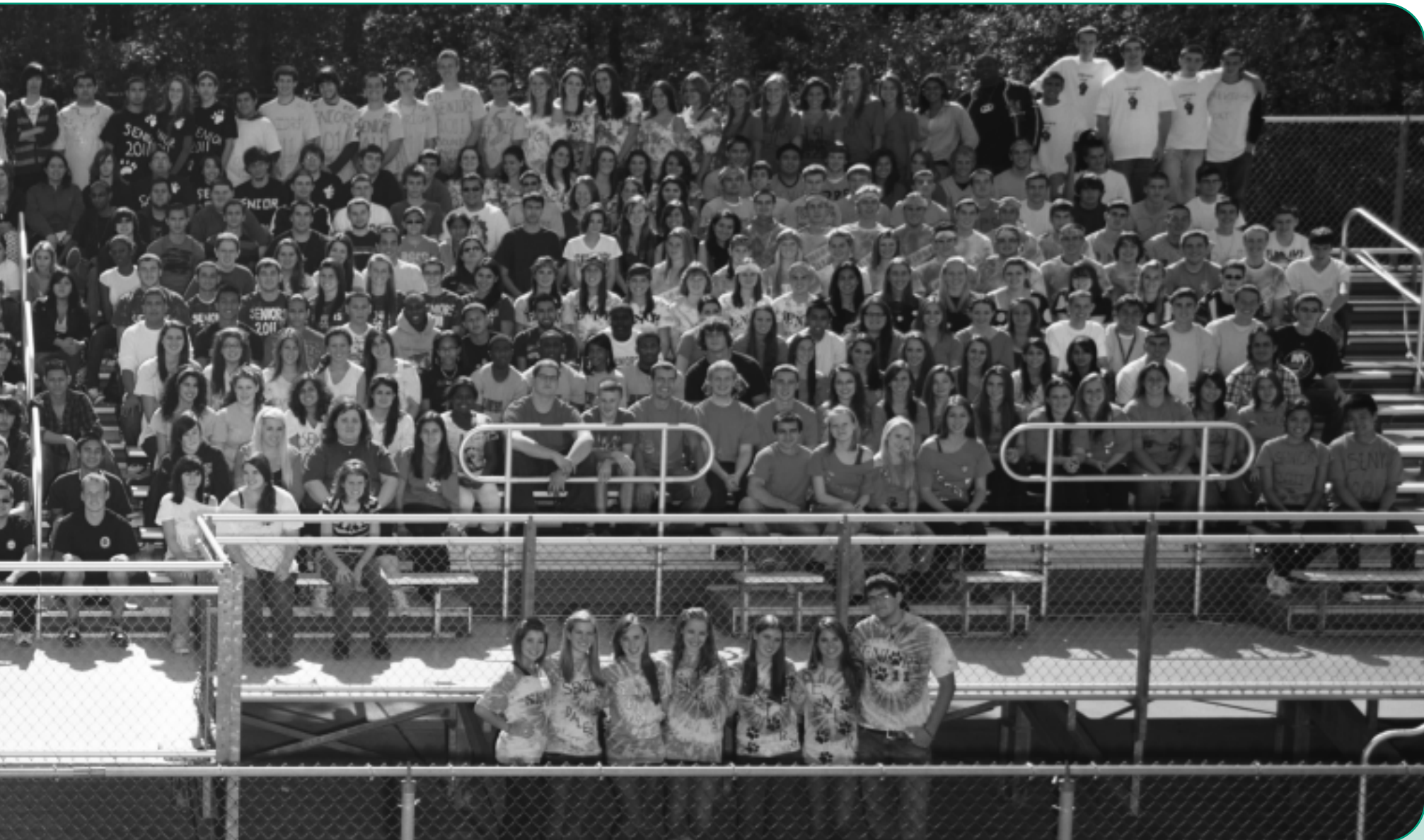

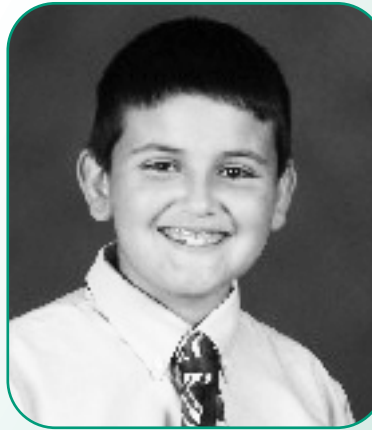
Moving Into

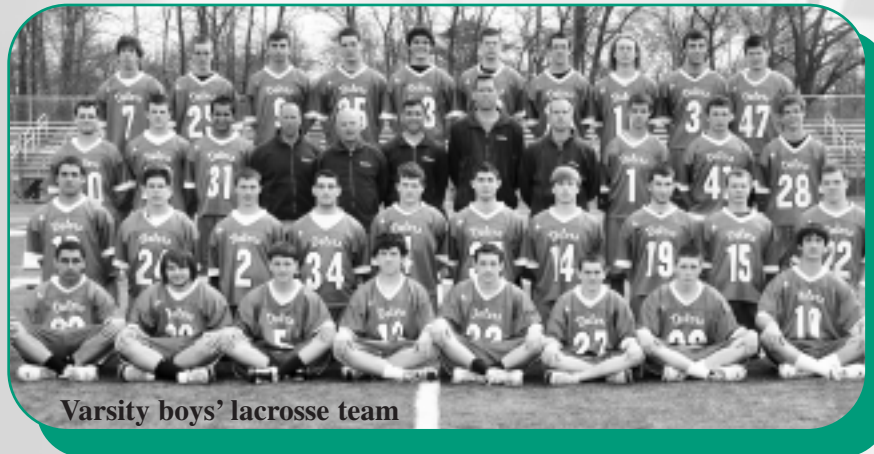
FROM THE SPORTS DESK

All 29 Varsity Teams Earn Scholar/Athlete Status for Second Straight Year!

It was another milestone year for Farmingdale athletics, as all 29 varsity squads – including all eight spring teams – were named Scholar/Athlete Teams. It is a great distinction for Farmingdale to have every one of these teams earn this distinction for the second year in a row. Scholar/Athlete teams are designated by the New York State Public High School Athletic Association (NYSPHSAA) for maintaining a combined GPA of at least 90 percent during the season. Listed below are just some of the highlights from the 2011 spring season:

The **boys' lacrosse** team won its first-ever New York State Championship! During the June 13 title game, the Dalers defeated Ithaca High School in overtime, 12-11, on a goal by Hofstra University-bound midfielder Korey Hendrickson. Congratulations to the boys and the coaching staff on a fantastic season!

The **girls' lacrosse** team captured the Nassau County Class A Championship title for its sixth consecutive year. Though they fell short of the Long Island Championship, the Lady Dalers provided another amazing season of lacrosse at a high level of play. The team is graduating eight exceptionally talented seniors and, to quote Coach Shari Campbell, "The legacy of these seniors is that they changed the history of this program of Lady Dalers lacrosse."

The **softball** team won its first-ever Long Island Championship, defeating perennial powerhouse Bay Shore 2-0. The Lady Dalers reached the New York State Championship game, but ultimately came up short against John Jay by a margin of 3-1. Congratulations to our outstanding softball players and Coach Laura Malone on an outstanding season.

The **boy's golf** team won its third straight Nassau County Championship, defeating Cold Spring Harbor by 35 strokes on the red course at Bethpage State Park. Freshman Matt Lowe's dazzling play this season earned him a place at the New York State Federation Tournament, held at Bethpage State Park's black course in June. Placement in this tournament is highly selective, as only the top six golfers from each of the four associations – New York State Public High School Athletic Association (NYSPHSAA), Public School Athletic League of New York City (PSAL), Catholic High School Athletic Association (CHSAA), and the Association of Independent Schools (AIS) – are chosen to compete. At the tournament's conclusion, **Matt Lowe captured the New York State Federation title with a one-over 72**, two strokes better than Xander McDonald-Smith from Scholars Academy!
