Call to Order

Meeting called to order at 6:20 p.m. in the A. Terry Weathers Board Room at the Howitt Middle School by Mr. Goldberg, President of the Board of Education.

Pledge of Allegiance

Board President Michael Goldberg welcomed those present and announced that the Board of Education was interested in encouraging all members of the public to share their ideas, comments and questions. He noted that public participation opportunities would be available at the beginning of the meeting and again at the end of the meeting and, as stated in Board Policy, no person should speak for more than three minutes and each period of public participation would be limited to thirty minutes. If there were questions or concerns regarding matters on the Consent Agenda, it would be important to utilize the first public participation opportunity as the Board would act on those items immediately.

Mr. Goldberg pointed out the emergency exit. The public session began with the Pledge of Allegiance.

## **Superintendent's Update**

## PTA Board Recognition

Superintendent of Schools Paul Defendini introduced PTA Council President Kate Kelly. Mrs. Kelly, along with representatives from SEPTA and each of the building PTA units, spoke about the long tradition that the district has enjoyed wherein the Board of Education trustees are thanked for their tireless efforts on behalf of the students and families of our community. Mrs Kelly presented a gift to each of the trustees with gratitude for the time they take from their own families to serve the families of Farmingdale Schools. Mrs. Lively thanked the PTA for their efforts and their support.

Dave Tellier-Nawrocki Smith (Independent Auditor) Superintendent of Schools Paul Defendini introduced Mr. David Tellier, Partner with the district's independent auditor firm, Nawrocki Smith. Mr. Tellier reviewed the process undertaken during this year's audit and review of the district's financial statements, extra-curricular funds, and federal award programs. He stated that the school district worked under a 45 day window for closing the district's year end and submitting final reports to the New York State Education Department. He described this year's audit as the "cleanest of the clean" and congratulated the Business Office staff and leadership for their efforts. Prior recommendations were implemented and closed. Mr. Tellier summarized the financial statements and stated that all fund balance and reserve fund balances are all within regulatory limits and follow NYSED guidelines.

Update

Superintendent of Schools Paul Defendini introduced Assistant Superintendent for Human Resources and Administration Glen Zakian. Mr. Zakian provided to the Board of Education an update on school security initiatives. His presentation began with an explanation of the efforts to bring parents and other community members into the discussion through Town Hall meetings that took place during the 2017/18 school year. Recommendations received were reviewed and prioritized. All schools are now operating under a secure perimeter model during the course of the school day; secure perimeter has been extended into the evening hours with limitations on access to the building through designated entry points. During the school day, visitors will be escorted to their destination after going through the doorway screening. The district is developing an emergency contact listing that will be available to residents in an effort to address evening and weekend concerns. Parents will also see an increased police presence in the buildings as the partnership between the district and local law enforcement continues to be a vital connection. Mr. Zakian also spoke of the safety initiatives during the summer months, which allows for better controls during recreation programs. He also spoke of changes at the Farmingdale High School rear entrances, the use of ID tags, community notifications, and the work of the school counselors,

psychologists and social workers as they assist students in crises. Mr. Zakian concluded his presentation stating that the security initiatives are continually under review. The district welcomes feedback and information from parents, community members and faculty members.

## Public Participation

Board President Michael Goldberg opened the meeting for the first public participation. Mr. Bell stepped forward and asked about the cost associated with the security initiatives. Mrs. Tranchina also had questions about the security presentation. Mrs. Trancina also congratulated the Fine Arts Department, and specifically the marching band for their show at the Newsday Marching Band Festival. She stated that the NYSSMA music levels for the students impressed her child's college representatives during her audition for entry into very competitive Music programs.

Mrs. D'Amico participated in the Howitt Middle School Mock Interview program. She congratulated Dr. Kuhner and the Family and Consumer Sciences staff on the work that prepared the students to behave appropriately and professionally during their interviews.

Mrs. Soete reported on the SEPTA meeting and the Student of the Month PTA event.

Mrs. Lively attended two workshops at Farmingdale High School, including a presentation related to the dangers associated with vaping and a second program focused on the opioid crises. Mrs. Lively participated in a number of Chamber of Commerce events and provided an update on the Farmingdale Youth Council's activities and events. Mrs. Lively attended the New York State School Boards Convention during the previous month. She provided an update on some of the changes to the resolutions that had been discussed by the Board of Education at a previous meeting.
