Meeting recessed for executive session at 6:00 p.m. In attendance were Mr. Goldberg, Mrs. D'Amico, Mr. Espinosa, Mr. Giordano, Mrs. Lively, Mr. Morales, Mrs. Soete, Mr. Defendini, Mr. Guercio and Ms. Miles.

At 6:30 p.m., Dr. Ripley, Mr. Zakian, Dr. Brennan, Dr. Olsen. Mr. Motisi and Mrs. Rogers joined in the Executive Session.

Meeting Meeting reconvened in the Howitt East Cafeteria at 8:00 p.m.

Reconvened
Board President Michael Goldberg welcomed those present and announced that the Board of Education was interested in encouraging all members of the public to share their ideas, comments and questions. He noted that public participation opportunities would be available at the beginning of the meeting and again at the end of the meeting and, as stated in Board Policy, no person should speak

for more than three minutes and each period of public participation would be limited to thirty minutes. If there were questions or concerns regarding matters on the Consent Agenda, it would be important to utilize the first public participation opportunity as the Board would act on those items immediately. Mr. Goldberg pointed out the emergency exit. The public session began with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Superintendent's Update

Presentation: Board President Michael Goldberg introduced Superintendent of Schools Paul Defendini and asked for his monthly Board and community update. Mr. Energy Defendini provided an overview of the district's initial Energy Performance Performance Contract, stating that the second phase was currently in the design phase. Contract Assistant to the Superintendent for Business, Michael Motisi, introduced representatives from Johnson Controls, Inc. (JCI) Dan Haffel, Robert Rolston and Pratik Thakker. Mr. Haffel detailed the projects anticipated in the EPC2, including exterior LED lighting upgrades, ceramic solar window films and solar panel parking structures for electrical consumption savings. Mr. Haffel described the design in each of the district building parking areas and provided photographs of the work accomplished at the Smithtown Schools. Mr. Haffel detailed the savings over the life of the projects and emphasized that there would be no cost to taxpayers.

Superintendent's Superintendent of Schools Defendini continued his update with a reporting of the First Annual Farmingdale Family Fun Night, which was a great success. Mr. Defendini stated that this was an opportunity for families to be present together doing activities that might not be part of their usual busy routines. He showed a video clip of the many examples of families participating in this important event.

Mr. Defendini continued with a summary of the emails and phone calls he had received regarding proposed state legislation regarding mandated HPV vaccinations. Mr. Defendini stated that the district was formulating a response from the Board of Education regarding this concern.

Finally, Mr. Defendini stated that the district was called to support the family of a student who had been killed in a traffic accident. He reported that each time administration, staff, students and families are called at times of greatest need, the response has always been overwhelming. He thanked the community for their efforts in supporting the family and each other. He stated that he is humbled by the work we do during the darkest days.

PublicBoard President Michael Goldberg opened the meeting for the first publicParticipationMrs. Coleman and Mrs. Kelly expressed their concerns of the
use of district buildings during local and national primaries and elections, as

well as during the May district budget vote and election. They raised questions regarding the safety and security during those events.

-Mrs. Kelly asked about cost savings anticipated in the Energy Performance Contracts. Mr. Defendini explained that the net savings is guaranteed; if not met, JCI would pay the overage.

-Mrs. Kelly asked if the baking courses at Farmingdale High School would be open to students in 6:1:1 classes. Dr. Ripley explained that there is open enrollment in the Baking 1 course; Baking 2 has a prerequisite of completing Baking 1.

-Mr. Stout provided feedback on the presentation of the solar panel parking structures and asked that the district keep in mind future property usage. He spoke to the safety and security concerns during elections. He stated that schools are often the largest buildings available to the community and that voting in a democracy is important, particularly as an example to students of civic responsibility. Mr. Stout asked if there were plans to add shrubbery and trees near the new athletic fields. He asked for an update on the gas moratorium.

-Mrs. DiPalma spoke of her concerns regarding the vaccination legislation.

-Student Juliann Perriera spoke of her frustration in losing the opportunity to attend Howitt Middle School due to the required vaccinations.
